Nan spoke to us on the huge challenges that our youth face and the gut wrenching situations that she encounters in her courtroom. Gang violence is a huge issue in our community. Many children go into gangs for personal safety. Many of them have terrible family backgrounds and many of them are victims and children of victims.

Currently in our county there are 470 children on probation. 85% are male. The average age is 16-18 years old. 61% of them are Latinos.

Two of the biggest issues **Nan** encounters are lack of school attendance and substance abuse. For substance abuse cases they have a high standard of accountability.

Nan closed by stating that she truly loves her job. She is making a difference.
